Part I: Thursday Workshops (July 18)

- One-day professional development workshops for AP teachers and administrators led by College Board–endorsed consultants. These consultants are hand-picked to make sure they deliver the best possible professional learning experience. You must be registered for this part of the conference to attend the Thursday Workshops
- Workshops have a 30-seat capacity. If your first-choice workshop is full, you'll have the option to add your name to the waiting list for that session. You may also opt to register for another workshop. Registration fees for the workshops include session materials.

Part II: Main Conference (July 19–20)

- Informational and opening plenary sessions on Friday morning followed by concurrent 75-minute sessions for AP and Pre-AP educators through Saturday. Main Conference registrants attend 75-minute concurrent sessions and one-hour plenary sessions on Friday, and Saturday. These sessions are led by a mix of educators from the AP and Pre-AP communities, Chief Readers from the AP Development Committee, and College Board staff.
- If you arrive early, there are activities available **Thursday afternoon** beginning at 1:30 p.m., including the exhibit hall and our Welcome session for first-time attendees.
- Main conference sessions are open to all registered attendees on a first-come, first-served basis.
